Terms and Conditions

- The Amnesty is for SILAGE WRAP only. Only Silage stretch wrap and silage sheeting may be loaded onto vehicles
- The scheme requires whole lorry loads of silage wrap only. Ie part loads CANNOT be collected as part of the scheme. Harby can quote for the collection of part loads separately outside of the Amnesty scheme. Lorries are articulated walking floor lorries typically 120 cubic Yard bulk vehicles which hold approximately 50 Solway liners of wrap.
- 3 Collection is from ONE collection point only
- 4 Host Farmer This is the farmer who organises a 'hub'.
- 5 Guest Farmer A farmer invited by a host farmer to bring his silage wrap for collection and recycling.
- 6 Hub. A hub is a loading point from which one whole lorry load of silage wrap is to be collected.
- 7 The host farmer must provide concrete hard standing and load the lorry on the day of collection within 2 hours. Walking floor lorries have high sides so a telescopic loader will be required.
- 8 The host farmer may invite Guest Farmers to bring their silage wrap for loading.
- 9 Guest farmers pay a £25 registration fee to Harby Agriculture Ltd. £5 of this will go to the RABI charity
- Host farmers do not pay a registration fee, they must fill in an online form but their collection is free.
- When the online form is submitted Harby Agriculture will agree a collection date on which the host farmer will load the silage wrap
- The host farmer gets together approximately 18 Tonnes of silage wrap which may be loose or bagged. Note bags must be polythene not old fert, seed or potato bags.
- Each guest farmer that fills in an online form for a hub collection and pays his/her registration fee will receive a waste transfer note from Harby Agriculture Ltd
- 14 Each Host Farmer will receive a waste transfer note free of charge upon loading the lorry
- 15 This offer is open to all farmers in mainland, England, Scotland or wales from1st June 2015 to 13th July 2015
